## DEDICATED SCHOOLS PROGRAM COORDINATOR

Adelaide Fringe has a dedicated Schools Program Coordinator who can assist you by:

Helping you to select a show appropriate for your students

Accessing discounted schools price tickets (where available) for your group

Accessing free tickets for teachers (based on the DECD teacher/student ratio)

Putting you in contact with artists for in-school performances and facilitating dedicated school shows

Organising and invoicing a school booking for any Fringe show (not just sessions with a schools price tickets)

Issuing your tickets.

Complimentary teacher tickets are issued according to the Department for Education

teacher/student ratio:

Pre-School – Year Two, One to Six (one teacher per six students)

Year Three - Year Six, One to Ten (one teacher per ten students)

Year Seven - Year Twelve, One to Fifteen (one teacher per fifteen students)

Additional teachers and supervising adults above the complimentary ratios are charged at the same price as student tickets.

## EQUITY DISCOUNT

Adelaide Fringe offers Category One to Four schools an Equity discount on each ticket purchased. This discount is made possible thanks to the generosity of Adelaide Fringe Foundation donors and supporters. Please note this initiative is capped. ## FIRST NATIONS CULTURAL TOURS

Sunday fifteenth February

Forty-five min duration

Tours run every twenty min from Two P M to Six P M

Learn about the spiritual and cultural connection to Country of First Nations people on an enriching and intimate Aboriginal cultural tour of Adelaide Botanic Garden. Gather at The Mulberry Arbor to meet your guide before exploring native plants, bush tucker and the social history of Australia's First Peoples. Experience a traditional smoking ceremony led by respected Elders and cultural leaders after the tour.

Selected tours will be accessible with the following services: Auslan Interpretation, Audio Description, tactile guided tour, and paved-surfaces only. The tours are forty-five minutes and are free, registration is required. Book now to avoid disappointment.
